BACKGROUND

In recognition of the importance of building the capacity of Aboriginal communities for self-determination and creating opportunities for Indigenous Australian students to complete vocational education, the North Central Catchment Management Authority (NCCMA) has made available a scholarship for Indigenous students commencing full-time studies at Bendigo TAFE.

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE TO APPLY?

To be eligible to apply for this scholarship, applicants must:

- Be a descendent of Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people, self-identify and be accepted as such by the Indigenous Australian community in which you currently reside .
- Be able to demonstrate that you have been or are overcoming significant disadvantage in pursuing your studies. Evidence is required, where possible.
- Be eligible for a Government funded place in your selected course.
- Have secured a place in your selected course prior to this application.

PLEASE NOTE

- Application for this scholarship does not mean the applicant will automatically be granted a scholarship.
- Scholarship applications will be determined by a panel of 3 IEC staff members.
- Deferring the course will make the scholarship void.
- The scholarship is to be used for one course and cannot be transferred to another course.
- Scholarships are not redeemable for cash.
- If a student fails a unit of competency from the course, they will incur any enrolment and/or other fees associated with resitting that unit.
- Applicants under the age of 18 need to obtain parental/guardian consent before submitting a scholarship application.

Disadvantage may include:

- Financial difficulty or low income
- English as a second language
- Disability or medical condition
- Family/caring responsibilities
- Geographical isolation/significant distance from campus
- Family crisis or difficult family environment
- Career/ Study disruption
- Other difficult circumstances

Evidence may include (you should have at least 3 of these):

- Enrolment paperwork
- Letter explaining circumstances
- Letter from doctor/ specialist
- Letter from case worker
- Letter from respected community elder
- Centrelink Income and Asset statement
- Budget
- Quote/receipts for education related expenses

WHO TO CONTACT FOR FURTHER INFORMATION

Scholarship applicants will be required to attend an interview with an Indigenous Engagement Officer as part of the process for consideration for scholarship. Please contact the Indigenous Education Centre at your campus or kjones@bendigotafe.edu.au

Any other information you should know about:

- Preference will be given to students studying Conservation and Land Management or Leadership and Management, but applications from students studying other courses will be considered.
- Preference will be given to students studying at a Certificate III or IV course.
- Scholarship applicants will be required to provide a statement describing their reason for applying and any hardship they have experienced, as well as a letter of support from an Aboriginal community member who is not a relative of the student.
- Scholarship applicants may also be required to provide Proof of Aboriginality. More information at aiatsis.gov.au/research/finding-your-family/before-you-start/proof-aboriginality
- Successful applicants will be expected to provide some outcomes information, such as a photo and short 'story of change': i.e. their goals and how the scholarship has assisted. This information may be used by both Bendigo TAFE and NCCMA in reports, newsletters and marketing material. As such, an image release form will need to be completed by the candidate.
- Successful applicants will be expected to attend at least one NCCMA engagement event. NCCMA will offer the scholarship recipient work placement.
- All applications will be reviewed by a panel of 3 IEC staff members. All decisions are final. Unsuccessful applicants may be informed by the Indigenous Education Centre (IEC) as to why they were unsuccessful. However, should you require further clarification you may want to contact the IEC directly.
