VET Delivered to Secondary Students (VETDSS) enables you to get real hands-on experience within a chosen industry, obtain a nationally recognised/accredited qualification and increase your career prospects by combining your secondary school studies with a Vocational Education and Training (VET) program.

#### **WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?**

- Provides the skills and ability to achieve competencies which will enhance your employment and further training prospects.
- Provides 'work-ready' knowledge and skills applicable to a variety of career paths in your chosen industry.
- May shorten the duration of an apprenticeship program after Year 12 through credit recognition and articulation arrangements.

#### **GUARANTEED PATHWAYS**

Students who successfully complete an eligible VETDSS course through Bendigo TAFE will be guaranteed a place in a pathway course - giving you peace-of-mind when it comes to your study choice after secondary school

### **THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW**

### **HOW TO APPLY**

#### PLACE ALLOCATION

For courses that run over two years, priority will be given to students in Year 11 for the first year. Year 12 students will not be accepted into the first year of a two year program.

Running of courses is dependent upon sufficient student numbers. Courses may be cancelled if minimum course numbers are not met.

#### **PROGRAM COSTS**

All VETDSS programs offered through Bendigo TAFE incur fees. Schools are notified of program costs in September. Program costs vary for each program. Bendigo TAFE invoices the secondary college directly for all programs and any student fees payable are set by the individual secondary colleges. All costs are invoiced directly to schools four weeks after the commencement of the program. Bendigo TAFE will not directly invoice VETDSS students or their parents.

#### **COURSE REQUIREMENTS**

- Absences: Students are required to notify their VET coordinator of non-attendance. Students must attend a minimum of 80 percent of a Bendigo TAFE VET program.
- Punctuality: Students are expected to arrive on time to all classes.
   Students who arrive more than 10 minutes after the class has started will be marked as late and their secondary schools will be notified. In some practical areas due to OHS students may be refused entry if late.
- 3. Catch-up classes: Students may be required to attend catch-up classes after school or during school holidays.
- 4. Code of Conduct: Students are expected to behave in a professional and courteous manner at all times; discipline procedures do apply.
- Withdrawal: Students who wish to withdraw from a VETDSS program must contact their VET coordinator who will inform Bendigo TAFE.
   Schools will not be charged a fee if a student withdraws before census date.
- Communication: Bendigo TAFE communicates directly with schools regarding the progress of students. Parents should direct queries to their school's VET coordinator who will contact Bendigo TAFE on their behalf.

Please note that students who fail to abide by these course requirements may be withdrawn from the Bendigo TAFE VET program and will be charged for the full cost of the program.

#### **DELIVERY OPTIONS**

All VETDSS programs are delivered on site and require students to attend a Bendigo TAFE campus. Where programs may have some delivery on-line, schools and students will be notified of the timetable in advance.

- Contact the VET coordinator at your school to discuss eligibility and confirm costs.
- 3. The VET Coordinator at your school will apply via the VETDSS Portal.
- Bendigo TAFE will notify schools of successful student applications.
   Your school will then notify you of times, campuses and equipment requirements.
